Those sites that you were addicted to before may need to take a backseat and make way for these new innovative sites!

ANIMOTO

You find yourself lacking hard drive space to install *Adobe Premiere* or have recently downloaded a corrupt copy of one but you need to do a photo-video presentation for the last minute birthday surprise for your friend. What do you do? Why, visit Animoto of course!

This free service allows you to generate professional slideshows just like a director! Edit the timbre of the voice, add some jazz beat to it and add some professional video effects. As their site says, it's "free, fast and shockingly easy."

PANDORA

Music is arguably sometimes called the universal language but most people do have preferences for their own. Some do not quite like the radio scene where DJs just keep on

playing what the masses dictate as currently popular. One would need a personal station for individuality and creativity. Well, good to know that you can do so, online, at PANDORA.

Pandora is sadly only available to the U.S., but if this service becomes open to the Philippines, this will be a site that music junkies couldn't live without. Best of all, it's free and despite the not-so-limited 40-hour limit per month, (which is already a lot of time), you only get to pay 99 cents for unlimited play for the rest of the month. GMAIL

What is hypertext/media? The Internet is one such medium where you see it. Remember that time when you googled about 16th century samurai, clicked links upon links, hours upon hours, and ended up on a video of sneezing pandas? That's hypertext/media in action. It shows information in a non-linear manner. Each bit of information is connected to another group of information where the viewers can opt and choose which part to read and examine.

SO WHAT IS IT, AND WHAT'S WITH THE '/'?

Hypertext and hypermedia are two separate terms though taken almost always as synonyms.

ORIGINS AND CONCEPTS

Ted Nelson coined the term "hypertext." He described it plainly as "non sequential writing." [1] Though often coupled with technology, it is not limited to the electronic

means of communication. In another account, Jakob Nielsen describes hypertext as allowing the users to be able to "move freely through the information according to their own needs." [1]

In 1945, Vannevar Bush proposed Memex or the Memory Expander. Its concept was to have a "mechanized private file library [2]" that would allow the retrieval of information in a more orderly, faster and easier manner in preparation for any type of information explosion of sorts. Though never implemented, his concept and theories heavily influenced the progression of hypertext technology.

Hypertext technology has become part of a growing means of communication and dissemination of information. It has proven to be resilient in the vast need and maintenance of the social media. Any means that use the concept of hypertext in order to meet an end or achieve its goal –such as relaying any sort of information to anyone else is considered Hypertext Media.

THE SOCIAL REALM

People cannot survive without other people. Social media has not only been part of important businesses but it also provided means to sustain networking, socializing and of course, pop culture. Society needs information to survive: people need to be aware on everything that is happening in order to react and respond properly. It is in the social realm where hypertext/media is explicitly created, seen, used and transformed. Let us take a closer look at some avenues and uses provided by hypertext/media.

THE WONDERFUL WORLD WIDE WEB AND SOCIAL MEDIA

THE ROAD TO SOCIAL MEDIA: A BIT OF THE EARLY YEARS AND NEED FOR ADAPTATION

Social media may have started manually through letters or even by word of mouth. From there, it took off to exploring technology and its electronic devices. The need for an easier access to other people grew with time. What would you do if a business client were half way around the globe? Snail mail would definitely be cumbersome. If you work far from your family, you would neither have enough free time to send them postcards, pictures and messages in order to be able to check on them nor would you always find free time to give them long distance phone calls. If you need detailed information on different topics, looking at card catalogues in index cards would take a while before you can even find the books you need.

From telephones and beepers, information had been disseminated through email and chat messages whether for business or personal affairs – much easier and convenient than writing with a pen and paper and of course faster than snail mail (most likely less expensive than long distance calls). When you are in need of specific detailed information, you have the electronic book catalogue where you can simply type keywords or topic you need –you can also opt to simply type it in the web browser and see where it leads you.

With the growing technology, it has not stopped there. With our progressing society, the needs of constant communication and flexible information retrieval are changing. Social media continues to evolve in the form of different blogs, video conferences and other

things. It simply adapts with the needs of society.

EARLIER, CONTINUING AND TRANSFORMING SOCIAL NETWORKS

Social networks are probably one of the most used forms of hypertext media or social media the world uses today. It allows us to relate to other people –see their thoughts and opinions and have meaningful discussions with them. It allows people to share part of their lives with others.

Early on forums or message boards has been a source of communication. People go to forums to discuss things they see interesting. They can create new "threads" under specific topics and they can post questions, statements, pictures and other things. They can post anything related to that thread whether it is a comment or opinion and the discussion can take as long as it can. Topics could include anything from politics, books, music, anime, fan fiction, actors, actresses – anything that spark the curiosity and interest of the users. It is a place where people can freely express themselves

Similarly, blogs and LiveJournals provide the same avenue for self expression. Some people "blog" about their daily life -whether they are sad frustrated or depressed. They use their blogs to show poems and stories they made or pictures and other stuff they made through graphic editing tools like Photoshop or Gimp. They use their blogs to share pictures and they can link to other people's blogs and comment on each other's blog.

As for LiveJournals, apart from your own blog, you can join or create communities wherein other users and members of that community can interact. Many other social

networking sites have come about like Friendster, MySpace or Multiply. Again, you can connect with your friends, read their posts, see the pictures or uploaded videos among other things. Probably the most used social network right now is Facebook.

What sets Facebook apart is it integrates your contacts with various mini games like Restaurant City. You can hire your contacts to become chefs and cook for your restaurant. You can also trade ingredients with them. Facebook games show a simulation that society needs each other in order to achieve its goal. For example, some games require you to invite your contacts so you can trade items with them or make them your ally. It is one of the most interactive social networks existing so far.

SPECIFIC OR NICHE SOCIAL NETWORKS

Media sharing has gone to a whole different level. Apart from the P2P sharing, there are sites which cater to specific forms of media. Photobucket was one of the first photo sharing sites that was rampantly used at one point in time [3]. You can simply upload different pictures you want and just modify which you want to keep private. Other stock photo sites or photo sharing networks include Flickr among others.

Other media like videos also have specific sites dedicated to them. The ever popular Youtube is probably one of the most used and known for video sharing. It ranges from movie previews, music videos, homemade videos and others. There are also sites – though not necessarily social networks, where you can stream television series online like surfthechannel or even entire movies. Generally, the qualities of the videos are

acceptable.

NEWS, NEWS, MORE NEWS... AND PROBABLY ANY OTHER THING OF INTEREST

With information readily available with just one click away, people have found ways to share news they find meaningful, interesting or simply humorous with other people. Digg and Reddit are examples of these. With Digg, viewers can choose to "dig" the post if they like it or simply "bury" it if otherwise. It can be any sort of news in any form of media. Reddit works in a similar manner.

Other sites, blogs included can also be specialized. For example, there are some food blogs can be dedicated solely to cake or cupcakes or some sort of "food art." Some sites, like Slashdot, are devoted to technologically related news. Websites are so diverse nowadays that you are bound to find a site that is of your taste. One way or another, there is always a way to get the information you need. If you are not sure where to look you can just "google" it.

WHERE ARE WE NOW?

Probably the most apt word to describe the lifestyle of today's society is "current." Everyone knows what is happening with almost everyone they know. Hypertext Media has developed greatly allowing people to know what is going on with other people's life in real time –or a very good approximation of it. Twitter, for example, allow people to share "tweets" –anything under the sun, in the form of short messages or links to videos and whatnot. Even actors and actresses have twitter accounts and anyone who connects with them can "follow" and see what they have to say.

In a similar manner, another form of micro blogging would be Plurk. Who has not heard of Plurk? Like Twitter, you can see the "plurks" in a timeline of the people you are connected to. People can comment on other people's post, making it look a sort of mini chat room. It has become so rampant in our context that it is probably the fastest way to disseminate information. Another growing form of blogging platform to look out for is Tumblr. It is a sort of short-form blog; again uses mixed media like photos, videos, quotes and others which is very customizable and easy to use. It is definitely something to look into if you have the time.

These avenues continue to grow and evolve with time and more avenues are in constant development. Hypertext Media allows you to stay connected with everyone and anyone; it gives a whole new dimension to the notion of having the world at the tip of your fingers. ¤
